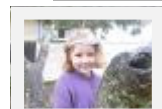
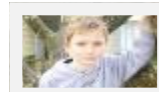
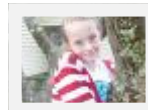


The school enjoyed a visiting performance from New Zealand Playhouse - "**Rap-unzel**" in the afternoon.

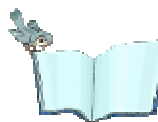
